From the Desk of Fr Craig Cameron

Jesus, in St. Mark's Gospel, compares the Kingdom of God to the grain of a mustard seed, the smallest of seeds. He makes the same comparison in other gospels when he speaks about the power of faith. "If," he says, you have faith the size of a mustard seed," nothing will be impossible, even moving mountains. What is it about the mustard seed that is so appealing to Jesus in relation to God's Kingdom and faith? It may have something to do with the smallness and hiddenness of the seed while buried in the ground and then the enormous growth into a great shrub, putting forth branches for birds' nesting. The growth of the Kingdom of God is similar. Jesus' small group of disciples become a multitude among the nations. Only with faith is such growth possible. In the soil of our hearts, God plants his Word, and our response is faith, a divine gift. At first, it is small and hidden. Jesus' disciples loved and followed him, but before the Resurrection and Pentecost, their faith was not strong enough. Like the mustard seed, it needed growth before doing the same work as Jesus. They had to trust him completely. Faith's power comes from God. Faith is the key to his Kingdom. Nourished by the Sacraments of the Church, particularly the Holy | Eucharist, faith grows like the mustard seed. It makes a life of love and service to the Lord of the Kingdom possible. Let us, as the disciples, ask Jesus to increase our faith.
